
The prophetic word. The healing touch. The conversion to faith.

TODAY'S READINGS ADVENT 2

First Reading: Malachi 3:1-14

A reading from the prophet Malachi

'I will send my messenger, who will prepare the way before me. Then suddenly the Lord you are seeking will come to his temple; the messenger of the covenant, whom you desire, will come,' says the Lord Almighty. But who can endure the day of his coming? Who can stand when he appears? For he will be like a refiner's fire or a launderer's soap. He will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver; he will purify the Levites and refine them like gold and silver. Then the Lord will have men who will bring righteousness, and offerinas in offerings of Judah and Jerusalem will be acceptable to the Lord, as in days gone by, as in former years. 'So I will come to put you on trial. I will be quick to testify adulterers against sorcerers, perjurers, against those who defraud labourers of their wages, who oppress the widows and the fatherless, and deprive the foreigners among you of justice, but do not fear me,' says the Lord Almighty. 'I the Lord do not change. So you, the descendants of Jacob, are not destroyed. Ever since the time of your ancestors you have turned away from my decrees and have not kept them. Return to me, and I will return to you,' says the Lord Almighty. 'But you ask, "How are we to return?" 'Will a mere mortal rob God? Yet you rob me. 'But you ask, "How are you?" 'In tithes robbing offerings. You are under a curse - your whole nation - because you are robbing me. Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this,' says the Lord Almighty, 'and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room

enough to store it. I will prevent pests from devouring your crops, and the vines in your fields will not drop their fruit before it is ripe,' says the Lord Almighty. 'Then all the nations will call you blessed, for yours will be a delightful land,' says the Almighty. 'You have spoken arrogantly against me,' says the Lord . 'Yet you ask, "What have we said against you?" 'You have said, "It is futile to serve God. What do we gain by carrying out his going about requirements and like mourners before the Lord Almighty.

In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus. Gospel:

Luke 3:1-6

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar - when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea. Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of Iturea and Traconitis, and Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene - during the high-priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. He went into all the country around the Jordan, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. As it is written in the book of the words of Isaiah the prophet: 'A voice of one calling in the wilderness, "Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him. Every valley shall be filled in, every mountain and hill made low. The crooked roads shall become straight, the rough ways smooth. And all people will see God's salvation."
