Hello Everyone! I'm back!

My annual leave was a very refreshing time away. I had the good fortune to get to know Bendigo for the month - and I was able to satisfy my three goals of bike riding, book reading and tasting a few bottles of happy juice.

There is a very picturesque rail trail from Bendigo to Heathcote that meanders through a few small villages and farm land. It was an incredible life-line and connector for the region in the late 19th and early twentieth century. My return trip to Bendigo on the particular day I had chosen was only marred by the 45km head wind. Before arriving in Warracknabeal, I was a mountain biker (not a road rider) and the Bendigo Regional Park provided a wonderful return to hills - I know REAL HILLS - and I managed to get lost several times in the trail labyrinths just south of the city. I also left a little bit of blood to the 'granite gods of Harcourt' in the mountain bike park specifically designated for this pursuit. "You can take the man off the mountain bike, but you cannot take the mountain bike out of the man."

I read a fascinating and engaging book about Matthew Flinders by Rob Mundle - what an incredible man and story. As Napoleon Bonaparte was fighting the English in the channel, he was trying to stay afloat as he circumnavigated Australia - the first man and his crew to do so ... I was deeply moved by the pursuit and endeavour of these brave (and maybe crazy) souls who genuinely took nothing for granted and I cannot imagine how they did it if I'm honest. It reinforced my own preference that "the more firma, the less terra." (Originally by George S. Kaufman: "I like terra firma: the more firma, the less terra.")

TODAY'S READINGS PENTECOST 21

First Reading:

Proverbs 1:20-33

A reading from the Prophet Job

Then the Lord spoke to Job out of the storm. He said: 'Who is this that obscures my plans with words without knowledge? Brace yourself like a man; I will question you, and you shall answer me. 'Where were you when I laid the earth's foundation? Tell me, if you understand. Who marked off its dimensions? Surely you know! Who stretched a measuring line across it? On what were its footings set, or who laid its cornerstone - while the morning stars sang together and all the angels shouted for joy?

Second Reading:

Hebrews 5:1-10

A reading from a letter to the Hebrews

Every high priest is selected from among the people and is appointed to represent the people in matters related to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal gently with those who are ignorant and are going astray, since he himself is subject to weakness. This is why he has to offer sacrifices for his own sins, as well as for the sins of the people. And no one takes this honour on himself, but he receives it when called by God, just as Aaron was. In the same way, Christ did not take on himself the glory of becoming a high priest. But God said to him, 'You are my Son; today I have become your Father.' And he says in another place, 'You are a priest for the order ever. in of Melchizedek.' During the days of Jesus' life on earth, he offered up prayers and petitions with fervent cries and tears to the one who could save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Son though he was, he learned obedience from what he suffered and, once made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him and was designated by God to be high priest in the order of Melchizedek.

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark


Then James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to him. 'Teacher,' they said, 'we want you to do for us whatever we ask.' 'What do you want me to do for you?' he asked. They replied, 'Let one of us sit at your right and the other at your left in your glory.' 'You don't know what you are asking,' Jesus said. 'Can you drink the cup I drink or be baptised with the baptism I am baptised with?' 'We can,' they answered. Jesus said to them, 'You will drink the cup I drink and be baptised with the baptism I am baptised with, but to sit at my right or left is not for me to grant. These places belong to those for whom they have prepared.' When the ten heard about this, they became indignant with James and John. Jesus called them together and said, 'You know that those who are regarded as rulers of the Gentiles lord it and their high officials over them, exercise authority over them. Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.'
