My heart continues to grieve deeply for the Ukraine conflict. So much pain.

People keep saying - "War is ugly." I think this is a gross understatement with the reports that keep reminding us of the consequences of 'fear' and 'greed' and 'fundamentalism' gone terribly, terribly wrong. When did fighting for an 'ideal' become a legitimate reason for genocide, to maim and oppress a people already economically and socially disadvantaged.

Where is the rest of the world?

It seems to me like we're yelling "fight, fight, fight" from the 'schoolyard' arena as we offer more and more equipment that will maim, kill ... whose responsibility is it to step in and say STOP! Is it not our place to protect the vulnerable? To stand-up against a bully? To confront violence at its very core: in the heart of our human being?

I wonder how they are dealing with 'fear', 'greed' and 'fundamentalism' at General Synod this week? Whose responsibility is it to say 'STOP!' - to prejudice, emotional violence and Christian Pharisee-ism? I'd love Jesus to turn up and tell a parable or two.

I wonder how we as a parish can help the families of the children who turned up to school on Tuesday morning without breakfast and without hot water in their house because the 'gas is out'? Where is Jesus when you need him? Go to the mirror?

I'd like to think that my vote really mattered next weekend - and it will! Hmmmm...

I hope amidst the noise of the world - you continue to hear 'the Creator of the Universe speak to you!' To know how treasured you are. To know you are capable of loving and being loved - as God intended.

TODAY'S READINGS FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

First Reading:

Acts 11:1-8

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

The apostles and the believers throughout Judea heard that the Gentiles also had received the word of God. So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticised him and said. 'You went into the house of and uncircumcised with men ate them.' Starting from the beginning, Peter told them the whole story: 'I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. I saw something like a large sheet being let down from heaven by its four corners, and it came down to where I was. I looked into it and saw four-footed animals of the earth, wild beasts, reptiles and birds. Then I heard a voice telling me, "Get up, Peter. Kill and eat." 'I replied, "Surely not, Lord! Nothing impure or unclean has ever entered my mouth." 'The voice spoke from heaven a second time, " Do not call anything impure that God has made clean." This happened three times, and then it was all pulled up to heaven again. 'Right then three men who had been sent to me from Caesarea stopped at the house where I was staying. The Spirit told me to have no hesitation about going with them. These six brothers also went with me, and we entered the man's house. He told us how he had seen an angel appear in his house and say, "Send to Joppa for Simon who is called Peter. He will bring you a message through which you and all household will be saved." 'As I began to speak, the Holy Spirit came on them as had come on us at beginning. Then I remembered what the Lord had said: "John baptised with water, but you will be baptised with the Holy Spirit." So if God gave them the same

gift he gave us who believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I to think that I could stand in God's way?' When they heard this, they had no further objections and praised God, saying, 'So then, even to Gentiles God has granted repentance that leads to life.'

God's dwelling-place is now among the people, and he will dwell with

them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God. "He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death" or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away.' He who was seated on the throne said, 'I am making everything new!' Then he said, 'Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true.' He said to me: 'It is done. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End.
