Happy Birthday Everybody! I hope that you've had a good week.

Here in the 'west' we have much to 'lose'.

I am often struck by people who have travelled to less developed countries and their usual remark is something like, "They have absolutely nothing, but they seem to be so happy." Why are 'we' so full of discontent? Why do so many struggle when it seems that 'we' and 'they' have so much? What are the 'stumbling blocks' that seem to get in the way of harmony and unity (not uniformity) within our communities – social, physical and regional?

I know that I've said it before - if we have food in your fridge, clothes on our back, a roof over our head and a place to sleep - we are richer than 75 percent of the world. If we have money in our bank, our wallet, and some spare change - we are among 8 percent of the world's wealthy.

The Holy Spirit doesn't do a 'means test' before we receive the benefits of God's Grace and mercy. The Holy Spirit does not consider the colour of our skin or the postcode of our current residence (or residences). The Holy Spirit does not even judge our actions - today, yesterday, or ten years ago.

The Holy Spirit or 'Advocate' - "the 'One' who hears the 'cry'" - of anyone willing and courageous enough to do so. An open heart to receive God's love, a longing or yearning for peace and solace, a challenging word or action to stand up for someone else ... the Holy Spirit is ready, waiting, expectant and extravagant! God's true Nature!

This Pentecost season - which aspect of God would you like to know better in order to strengthen your faith and conviction in the God who really cares?

TODAY'S READINGS SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

First Reading:

Acts 2:1-21

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled. they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language. They were astounded, and in amazement they asked, "Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans? Then how does each of us hear them in his native language? We are Parthians, Medes, and Elamites, inhabitants of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the districts of Libya near Cyrene, as well as travelers from Rome, both Jews and converts to Judaism, Cretans and Arabs, yet we hear them speaking in our own tongues of the mighty acts of God "

The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children. Now if we are children, then we are heirs—heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ, if indeed we share in his sufferings in order that we may also share in his glory.

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John

Philip said, "Lord, show us the Father and that will be enough for us." Jesus answered: "Don't you know me, Philip, even after I have been among you such a long time? Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? Don't you believe that I am in the Father, and that the Father is in me? The words I say to you I do not speak on my own authority. Rather, it is the Father, living in me, who is doing his work. Believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; or at least believe on the evidence of the works themselves. Very truly I tell you, whoever believes in me will do the works I have been doing, and they will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father. And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.
