Hello Everyone! I hope that I find you well and in good spirits.

I have just had a ZOOM meeting with the Bishop (Thurs afternoon) regarding the requirements to 'move forward' with what the Anglican Province of Victoria has decided to implement to comply with Government directives etc.

I feel angry. I am deeply affronted by what will become our 'normal' for a few months until we get to whatever landmark the 'powers that be' determine that things can change again. I feel exhausted by it ALL! Despite my discomfort and remonstrations - which the Bishop understands and empathises with - our humble little parish will need to comply with the following.

9.30am HC Service - fully vaccinated church service (30 people max)

Participants must:

- a) provide evidence of their fully vaccinated status;
- b) follow ALL COVID protocols deemed necessary to keep people safe;
- c) understand that non-compliance means that they will be turned away.

5.00pm HC Service - vaccination status \underline{not} required in Parish Centre (20 people max) - and advertised as such:

Participants understand that they:

- a) will be made aware that their vaccination status is not required for entry;
- b) can be vaccinated or have chosen not do so or have chosen not to reveal their vaccination status which does not exclude them from this worship service;
- c) must follow ALL COVID protocols already in place for safety and wellbeing.

Despite the fact that my whole being cries "NOOOOOO!", I have reassured the Bishop that I will exercise leadership expressed in his directives above to:

- a) ensure we are not fined or legally compromised in the parish;
- b) to bring security to those who want to feel secure and safe in church; and,
- c) to provide, "clarity: without making it impossible for others to attend church."
- d) Comply with Victorian Province good practise and governance.

TODAY'S READINGS PENTECOST 22

First Reading:

Job 42:1-6, 10-17

A reading from the Prophet Job

Then Job replied to the Lord: 'I know that you can do all things; no purpose of yours can be thwarted. You asked, "Who is this that obscures my plans without knowledge?" Surely I spoke of things I did not understand, things too wonderful for me to know. 'You said, "Listen now, and I will speak; I will question you, and you shall answer me." My ears had heard of you but now my eyes have seen you. Therefore I despise myself and repent in dust and ashes.' After Job had prayed for his friends, the Lord restored his fortunes and gave him twice as much as he had before. All his brothers and sisters and everyone who had known him before came and ate with him in his house. They comforted and consoled him over all the trouble the Lord had brought on him, and each one gave him a piece of silver and a gold ring. The Lord blessed the latter part of Job's life more than the former part. He had fourteen thousand sheep, six thousand camels, a thousand voke of oxen and а thousand donkeys. And he also had seven sons and three daughters. The first daughter he named Jemimah, the second Keziah and the third Keren-Happuch. Nowhere in all the land were there found women as beautiful as Job's daughters, and their father granted them an inheritance along with their brothers. After this, Job lived a hundred and forty years; he saw his children and their children to the fourth generation. And so Job died, an old man and full of years.

Second Reading:

Hebrews 7:21-28

A reading from a letter to the Hebrews

"...but he became a priest with an oath when God said to him: 'The Lord has sworn and will not change his mind: "You are a priest for ever." Because of this oath, Jesus has become the guarantor of a better covenant. Now there have been many of those priests, since death prevented them from continuing office; but because Jesus lives for ever, he has permanent а priesthood. Therefore he is able to save completely those who come to God through him, because he always lives to intercede for them. Such a high priest truly meets our need - one who is holy, blameless, pure, set apart from sinners, exalted above the heavens. Unlike the other high priests, he does not need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his

own sins, and then for the sins of the people. He sacrificed for their sins once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints as high priests men in all their weakness; but the oath, which came after the law, appointed the Son, who has been made perfect for ever.

When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout, 'Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!' Many rebuked him and told him to be quiet, but he shouted all the more. 'Son of David, have mercy me!' Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him.' So they called to the blind man, 'Cheer your On feet! He's you.' Throwing his cloak aside, jumped to his feet and came to Jesus. 'What do you want me to do for you?' Jesus asked him. The blind man said, 'Rabbi, I want to see.' 'Go,' said Jesus, 'your faith has healed you.' Immediately he received his sight and followed Jesus along the road.
