First Reading:

**Genesis 1:1-5** 

### A reading from the book of Genesis

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters. And God said, 'Let there be light,' and there was light. God saw that the light was good, and he separated the light from the darkness. God called the light 'day', and the darkness he called 'night'. And there was evening, and there was morning – the first day.

## Response: The Lord will bless his people with peace

## A reading from the of Acts of the Apostles

While Apollos was at Corinth, Paul took the road through the interior and arrived at Ephesus. There he found some disciples and asked them, 'Did you receive the Holy Spirit when believed?' They answered, 'No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit.' So Paul asked. 'Then what baptism did you receive?' 'John's baptism,' they replied. Paul said, 'John's baptism was a baptism of repentance. He told the people to believe in the one coming after him, that is, in Jesus.' On hearing this, they were baptised in the name of the Lord Jesus. When Paul placed his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came on them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied. There were about twelve men in all.

Gospel: Mark 1:4-11

## A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark

And so John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to him. Confessing their sins, they were baptised by him in the River Jordan. John wore clothing made of camel's hair, with a leather belt round his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. And this was his message:

'After me comes the one more powerful than I, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. I baptise you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.' At that time Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptised by John in the Jordan. Just as Jesus was coming up out of the water, he saw heaven being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: 'You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased.'

#### THE PROPERS

**Collect:** Eternal God, at the baptism of Jesus in the river Jordan you proclaimed him your beloved Son, and anointed him with the Holy Spirit: grant that all who are baptised into his name may keep the covenant they have made, and boldly confess him as Lord and Saviour; who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, in glory everlasting. **Amen**.

### **Project REGENERATE Update**

During the week, we received word from the Leith Charitable Trust that we were successful in our Grant Application for funding towards the GLAD Project - which continues from last year, <u>AND</u> a new ZMorph Project which will begin in 2021. This news was accompanied by a cheque for \$22,000. We were also successful in being able to 'carry over' funds not spent in 2020 due to COVID restrictions - which were considerable.

The GLAD Project enables Rev James to conduct various programs in schools throughout the region - programs are booked for Term 1, 2 & 4 already.

The Zmorph Project - is an exciting new addition and extension to our current 'youth programs' that we have established in recent years within the parish, and will operate out of the Parish Centre - in a 'space' yet to be designated.
