Hello Everybody! I hope that you've had a good week.

I trust that your pilgrimage to Bethlehem is going smoothly and that you haven't had to lean on the donkey too much. However, it is there if you need it!

I've got two questions for you this week:

What is your Christmas Prayer? What is your Christmas wish?

As people of faith - we trust that God not only listens to our prayers - but answers them. This means - we must take responsibility for 'what we ask for' ... and maybe God doesn't respond to what we want, but rather what we need.

Jesus gave us a hint in The Lord's Prayer. Deeply rooted in our relationships - with God and then those around us - we are guided to honour/worship, confession and forgiveness and then a 'return to wholeness' (ie. Salvation) - and hopefully joy!

Which aspect of The Lord's Prayer will you focus on this week?

Regarding your Christmas wish - some people may say - why would Christians 'wish' for anything? It might be perceived that our faith is compromised.

I ask this question on purpose - because sometimes we are uncertain about what to pray for. Therefore, identifying a 'wish' (or call it desire, hope, aspiration, inspiration ...) allows us to focus on what might be possible in relationship with God - and as the text tells us - NOTHING is impossible to God.

Maybe that broken relationship can find healing. Maybe division in our community will dissipate and goodwill will return. Maybe you and I can genuinely aspire to 'institution reform' and see people in need access the services that they require easier. Maybe your heart's desire – is also God's heart's desire for you/us. Maybe – just maybe you are more powerful than you think in influencing the matters of consequence in our world, our community, our region.

TODAY'S READINGS THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

First Reading:

Isaiah 35:1-10

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

The desert and the parched land will be glad; the wilderness will rejoice and blossom. Like the crocus, it will burst into bloom; it will rejoice greatly and shout for joy. The glory of Lebanon will be given to it, the splendour of Carmel and Sharon; they will see the glory of the Lord, the splendour of our God. Strengthen the feeble hands, steady the knees that give way; say to those with fearful hearts, 'Be strong, do not fear; your God will come, he will come with vengeance; with divine retribution he will come to you.' Then will the eyes of the blind be opened and the ears of the deaf unstopped. Then will the lame leap like a deer, and the mute tongue shout for joy. Water will gush forth in the wilderness and streams in the desert. The burning sand will become a pool, the thirsty ground bubbling springs. In the haunts where jackals once lay, grass and reeds and papyrus will grow. And a highway will be there; it will be called the Way of Holiness; it will be for those who walk on that Way. The unclean will not journey on it; wicked fools will not go about on it. No lion will be there, nor any ravenous beast; they will not be found there. But only the redeemed will walk there, and those the Lord has rescued will return. They will enter Zion with singing; everlasting joy will crown their heads. Gladness and joy will overtake them, and sorrow and sighing will flee away.

Gospel:

Matthew 11:2-11

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew

When John, who was in prison, heard about the deeds of the Messiah, he sent his disciples to ask him, 'Are you the one who is to come, or should we expect someone else?' Jesus replied, 'Go back and report to John what you hear and see: the blind receive sight, the lame walk, those who have leprosy are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the good news is proclaimed to the poor. Blessed is anyone who does not stumble on account of me.' As John's disciples were leaving, Jesus began to speak to the crowd about John: 'What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed swayed by the wind? If not, what did you go out to see? A man dressed in fine clothes? No, those who wear fine clothes are kinas' in palaces. Then what did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. This is the one about whom it is written: "I will send my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way before you." Truly I tell you, among those born of women there has not risen anyone greater than John the Baptist; yet whoever is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.

We ask this through your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**
